Here is an update for you on our Home Learning Offer in response to the Parent/Child Surveys:

Issue Raised	Solution
Timekeeping of 'Live' lessons when brothers and sisters are sharing a device.	We have now loaned out 90 laptops to help families with more than one child to access the 'live' learning. Please contact us if you would like one
We would like more teacher 1 to 1 sessions	Extra phonics sessions for children across school are in place, alongside intervention sessions and extra help sessions. Your child will now hopefully be accessing targeted support if it is required.
Missed sessions	We now aim to upload the flipcharts the teachers will use after each lesson into the chat.
There is no time for social time to support my child's wellbeing	Organised social time is now in place.
Can we have whole school assemblies?	Mr Johnson records a weekly assembly for you to view at a convenient time 📺.
How are you checking the work my child produces? Sometimes they feel it is pointless as it won't be marked.	Our teachers are starting to introduce quizzes, Writing assignments on Teams and other software solutions. They are also bringing the afternoon subjects into their morning sessions, so the work done from the packs is then used to influence their Reading and Writing in the morning sessions. Of course, at any point you can send work in by email or on the chat functions.
We need rewards or dojos – something to keep my child motivated.	Class teachers are working this out for their classes and we will make sure that these are received in every class. We are experimenting with a 'dojo' app – watch this space

New Drop Off / Pick Up Routines

You will have probably noticed the drop off and exit points are busier this week with the increases in numbers of families needing school places. We now have 300 children accessing school to support critical workers, to support special circumstances or for respite. We are constantly reviewing the children coming to school and the requests to be in school and may be asking some families to only attend on a part-time basis to ensure we are keeping everyone safe.

After half term we are making these changes:

Lower School Morning drop off

- Reception Green and Reception Yellow will come in on the corner gate on Wykeham in the morning only. This is where they always used to come in.
- Everyone else in Reception Blue, Reception Red, Year 1 and Year 2 stays the same.

Lower School End of the day collection

Nothing is changing.

KS2 Morning drop off

• The 'All Weather Pitch' will be opened up as an additional entrance for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. These Year groups now have a choice which entrance to come in.

KS2 School End of the day collection

- The 'All Weather Pitch' is where Year 3 and Year 5 will come out.
- Wooler Street Playground is where Year 4 and Year 6 will continue to come out.

If you have children in Year 3 and 4 for example, we will organise it so they can both come out of the same entrance. Parents won't be able to use the playground because the one-way system is integral for maintaining social distancing. We are sure you will support this as since March 2020, we have only had three confirmed cases in school and two instances of Bubble closures. This is because of all our efforts.

So, have a brilliant half-term. I hope you get chance to get some fresh air, catch-up with loved ones online and to participate in the skipping extravaganza!
