- **EYFS + KS1 (Y1 + Y2)** – Could you draw a picture or create a piece of artwork of your chosen hero?
- **LKS2 (Y3 + Y4)** – Could you write a short poem about your hero? It could be an acrostic, a rhyming one, a non-rhyming one or a haiku! You can illustrate it too.
- **UKS2 (Y5 + Y6)** – Could you create a fact file/character profile of your chosen hero?

(Explain who they are, what they mean to you, what they do and how they've been so brave and heroic, do they inspire you?)

Please make sure, whether you are returning a photograph of the work via email or on paper to your class teacher, to state: your name, your class and our school.
