	Segment and spell independently in journals: hammer, ladder, summer
	Task: Create a picture for each word
Reading	Read one of your phonics books. If you have internet access you can register on Oxford Owl where you can have access to ebooks. I suggest to choose a "pink" or "red" level book to share with your child.
	Task: Can you re tell the story without looking back?

	<b>Task:</b> In your journal can you draw two of the animals you remember from the story? Talk about what those animals said in the story. Write a label or sentence to match your picture.

	Additional Task: Using your favourite toys (cars, lego bricks, dolls, teddies) practise adding groups of them together. Count on
	from the highest value in a group. For example, three toy cars parked at the car park, then three more came. Put three in
	your head and count on 3 (4,5,6).
Science	Task: Go on a spider hunt!
	Discuss what features are different about a spider compared to other insects?
	How many legs does a spider have?
	Are there different types of spiders?

Phonics	Sounds of the day 'ure' and 'er'
	Read: pure manure dinner
	Segment and spell independently in journals: pure gold, banner, hammer
	Task: Make a word hunt for your grown- ups (or the other way around) where the words are written on pieces of paper and
1	hidden around your house. Can you remember any of the words you found and write them down?
Reading	Read one of your phonics books. If you have internet access you can register on <a href="https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk">https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk</a> where you can
	have access to ebooks. I suggest to choose a "pink" or "red" level book to share with your child.
	<b>Task:</b> Choose your favourite picture in the book and describe what is happening. Use your own words and full sentences.
Writing	Can you keep a diary for what you do each day for a week? This could be a picture with simple words, captions or sentences.
	Remember to include some tricky words too.

	Additional task: Give each of your teddies (or any objects) a number from 1 – 12. Throw two dice (or pick numbers out of
	two bags). Add the numbers together. Which teddy have you won?
PSHE	With your family talk about and/or make a list of three things that make you happy and three things that you can do to
	make someone else happy.

Phonics	Phase four phonics. This means words with more than three sounds. For example, green, hand, belt as opposed to cat, mat,
	hen, tree

	Read: hand, band, sand, stand
	Sentence – I stand in the sand.
	Segment and spell independently in journals: hand, band, sand, stand – Can you write a sentence with one of the words in it?

Reading	Read your tricky words together with a grown-up

	Additional task: Measure and count out the ingredients to bake something (read the numbers in the recipe).
Geography	Look at a map of the world. Which parts show land and which show sea? Which are the largest countries and which are the smallest? Ask a grown up to tell you what the weather is like in different countries. Why is the weather so different around the world?


Phonics	Phase Four Phonics - st
	Read: stop, steep, stamp The hill is steep.
	Segment and spell independently in journals: stem stick stop
	Extra challenge: Write a sentence with one of the words you have read or written.
Reading	Story time: Share a book of your choice with a grown-up.
	Task: Can you retell the story to your grown up? Who was your favourite character and why? Draw or make your favourite
	character from the story? Can you label your picture?
Writing	Write a list of the animals in the story? Can you write them in the right order of which the spider met them? Can you change
	the story and think of other animals that the spider could have met. Draw or make one more character that the spider could
	have met and label it or write a sentence about it.



Art	Can you make a spider using an egg box and string or wool?




Phonics	Phase Four Phonics

	small or large? Anything you wish!
	Write a sentence for your spider with the help of your grown ups. Make sure you use lovely describing words in your sentence.

	them in water. Were you right? What is the difference between objects that float and sink?
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
