Writing	How to uncover a Soupee bird by Maria Richards
	Task: In the poem 10 Things in an Explorers Rucksack, which we looked at two weeks ago for home learning, the author mentioned the feather of a Soupee bird. The text How to uncover a Soupee bird explains how to see this very shy bird up close. Read the instructions: How to uncover a Soupee bird. (resource 2, page 15 and 16). Next, think about what mysterious, rare thing you would love to see up close? What would you like to photograph? A fairy? A giant? A wizard? A Pokemon? A minotaur? A T-rex? A mermaid? A unicorn? Something else? Draw and write about what you would like to see in your home learning journal. Then move onto the design challenge. Design a trap to tempt your creature out of its hiding place. Draw it in the space provided (page 17 of resource 2) Don't forget to label it.
