	<b>Task:</b> Re read Chapter 1. In this Chapter, Cally and her family leave their old life behind to start a new life at Rose Cottage.
	Choose from one of the pictures of houses. Cut your chosen image out and stick into your journal. Imagine you have moved there. Write a detailed description of the house in your journals or on word.
	<b>Describe –</b> Describe the picture using expanded noun phrases. Imagine what it would be like to be standing in front of the house. What sounds would you hear? What would be the general atmosphere feel like?

	Walking Inside – Imagine walking through the front door. Does it feel spacious, cosy, cramped, eerie, light and airy or dark and dingy? Does the house have a particular smell?  Sounds – What sounds can be heard inside? If the house is old, perhaps the floorboards creak or maybe the wind makes the windows rattle. Think about where the house is located. Can sounds of woodland, the sea or the city be heard?  Best Feature – What is the best feature of the house? Perhaps one of the rooms is more impressive than the others. Maybe you like the cosy feeling of the tiniest room in the house.  Improvements – What would you change about the house?
