Writing	<p>Look at the picture 'A Dangerous Pet' on sheet 4 again.</p> <p>Story starter!</p>

	<p>The King had known that the gift he presented to his children on their 5th birthday was dangerous. He was prepared to take the risk of letting them own a pet dragon, however. One day, the twins would rule the kingdom together, and they would need all the help they could get. No-one could deny that a dragon was a powerful ally!</p> <p>Before that day, though, the children had much work to do. They had to train their dragon!</p> <p>Can you continue the story? <p>Spelling</p>	<p>Quiz!</p> <p>Task: Ask an adult, to say 10 words from this week (either Year 3/4 words and/or 'sure' words) and write them down. How many can you spell correctly?</p>
<p>Reading</p>	<p>Battle of Bosworth</p> <p>Re-read the text 'The Battle of Bosworth'</p> <p>Yorkshire and Lancashire battled for control of the throne (who would be the king of England) for many years.</p>

	<p>This was known as the War of the Roses. The white rose was a symbol of Yorkshire; the red rose was a symbol of Lancashire.</p> <p>The Battle of Bosworth ended this argument as Henry VII united the two counties. How did he do this? Henry (from Lancashire) married Elizabeth (from York). This united the two counties and from this, the Tudor Rose was made (which is half red and half white).</p> <p>Task: Why do you think Henry VII did this? Why would he marry someone who had been from his enemies' family? Explain your answers in detail. Write these ideas in your journal.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Resource 1: Pages 1-3</p>
Writing	<p>Editing and improving. (Sheet 4)</p> <p>Task: Read through your story from yesterday. Check for any spelling and punctuation mistakes and correct them. Have you written in paragraphs? Can you think of more powerful and exciting words to use to up-level your work? Have you punctuated any speech correctly (inverted commas and other punctuation)?</p> <p>Can you write your final draft ensuring your handwriting is formed neatly and your letters are joined?
