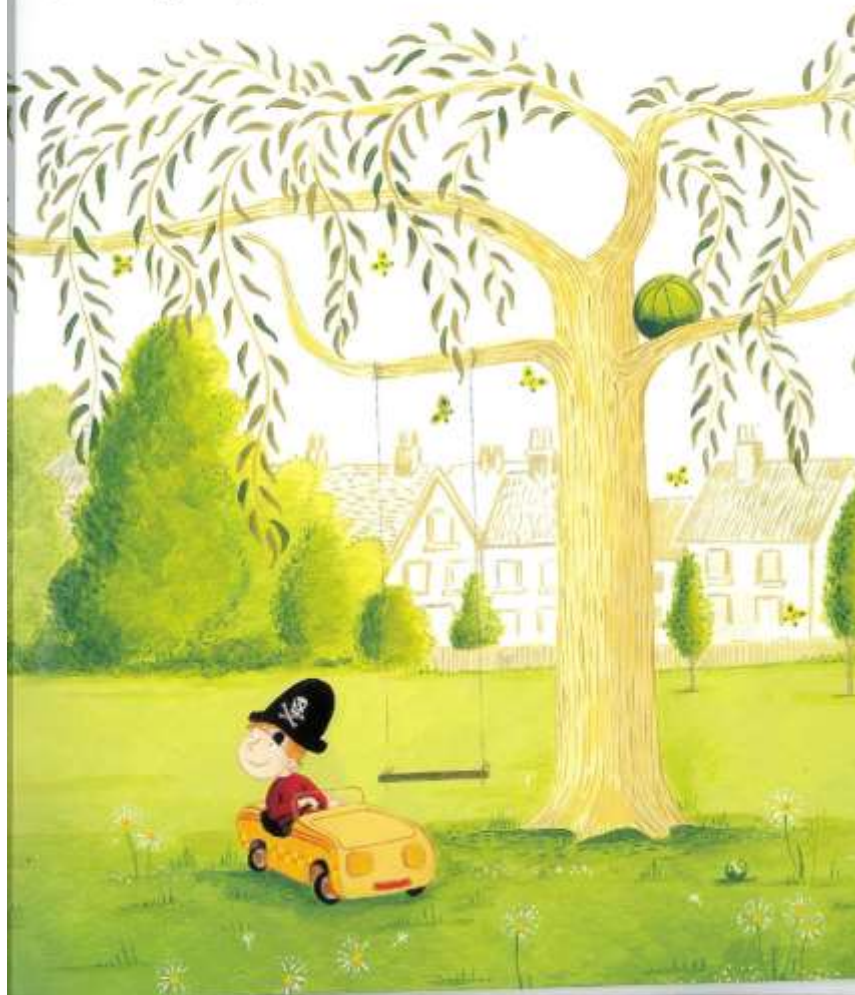

Big enough for a boy and his pet dinosaur.

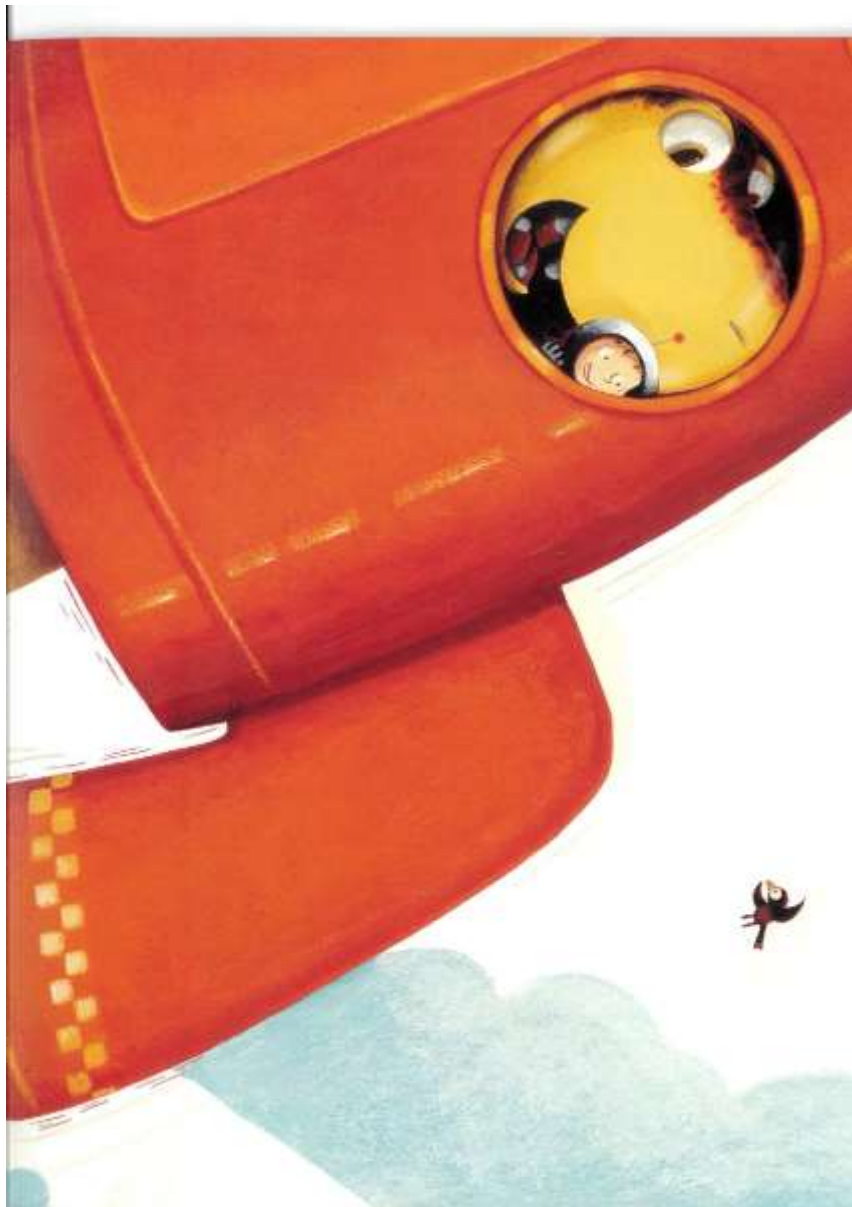


They ignored all the warnings – they couldn't care less.

A disastrous dinosaur feast had begun!

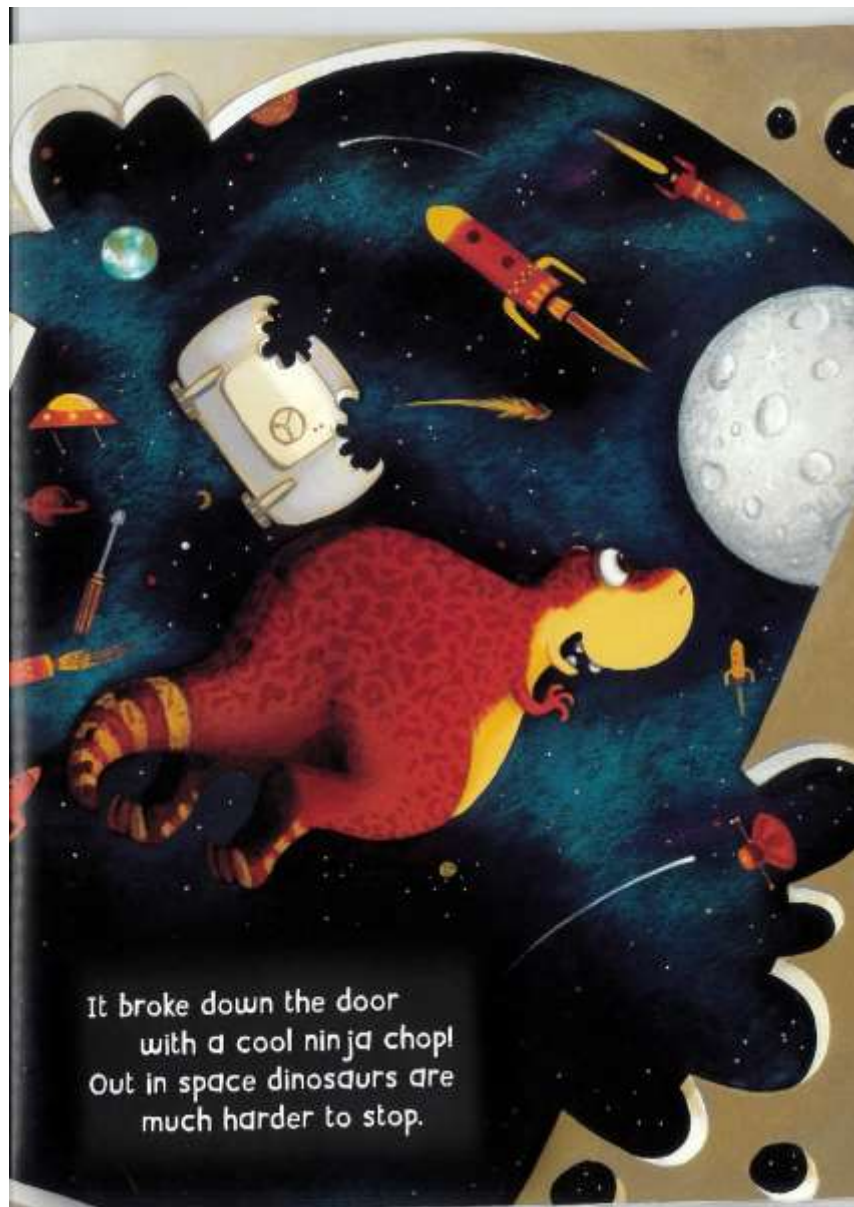


It gobbled up gadgets and gizmos galore –

Outside there were more things to eat – there was plenty!

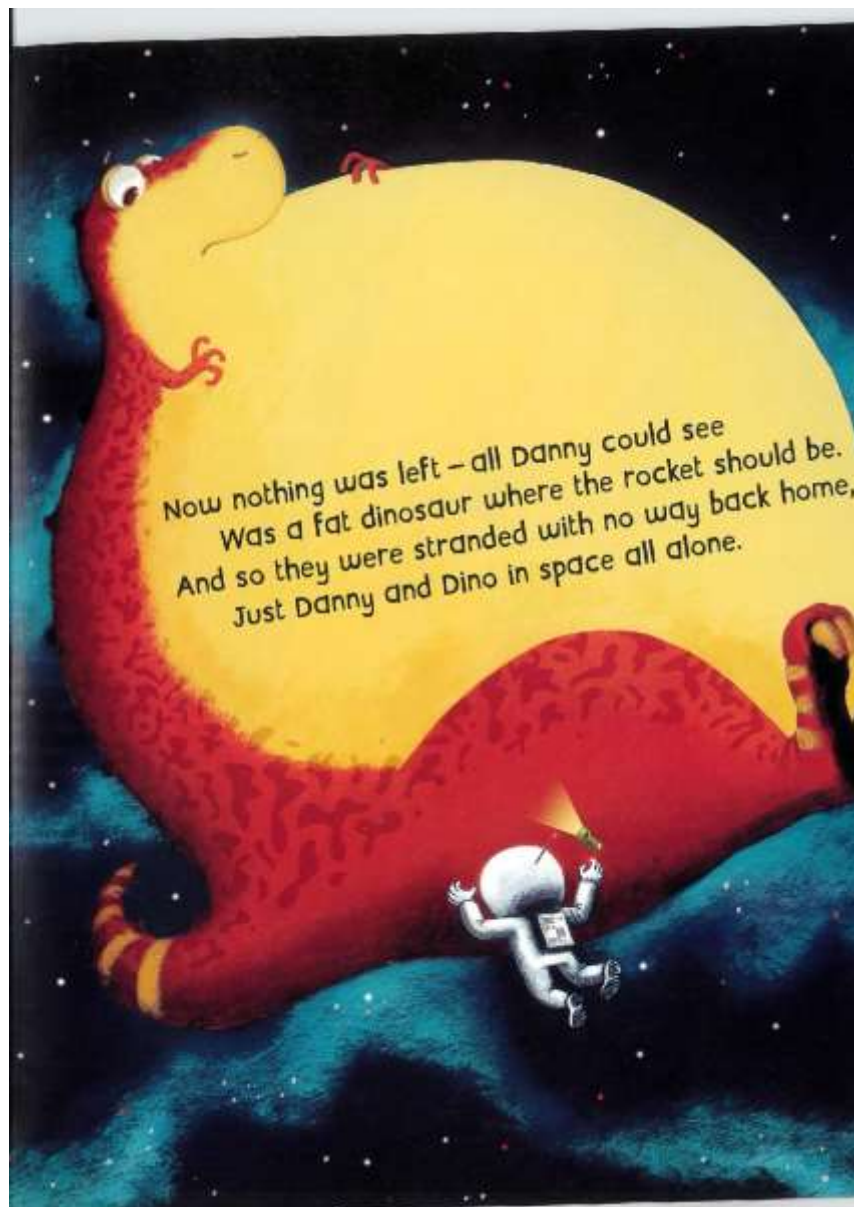




It munched on the Martians from Mars and their cats

Just Danny and Dino in space all alone.

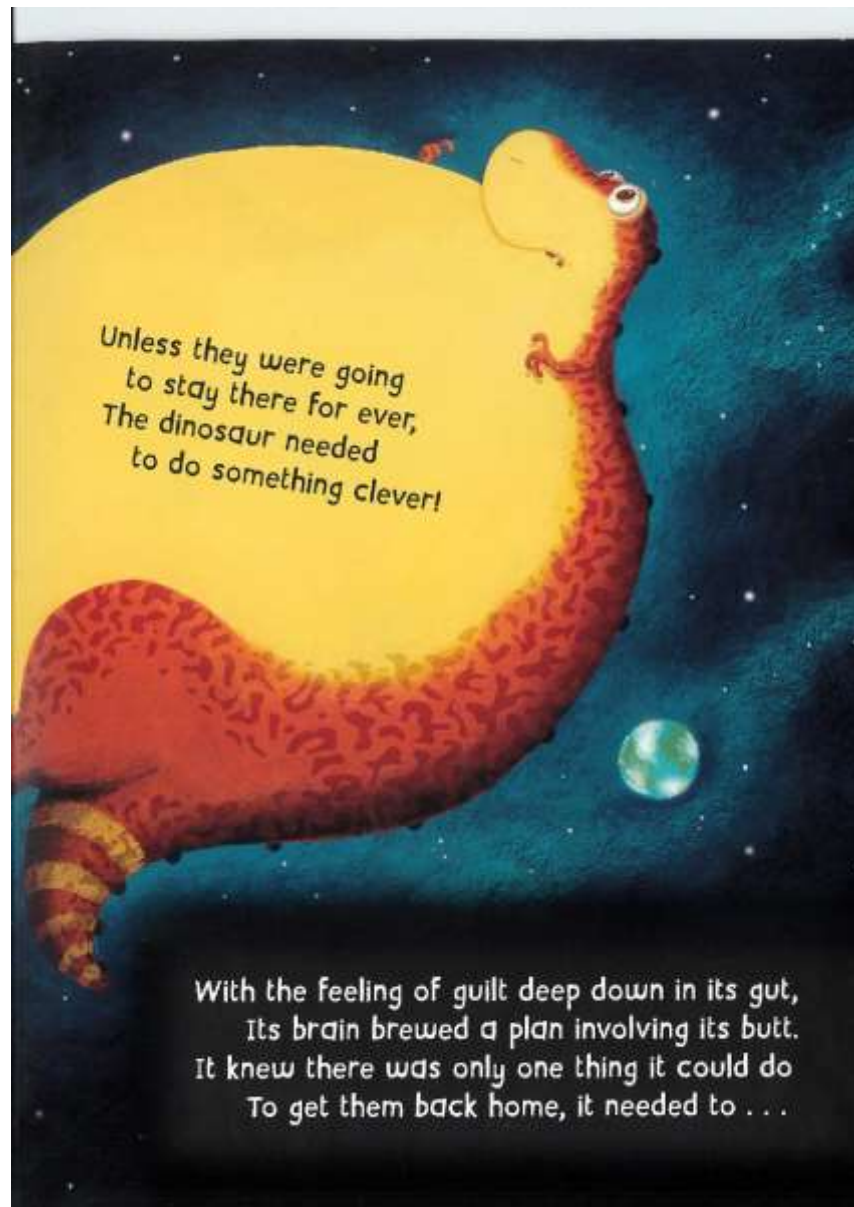
Now Danny was crying,

space suit inside.



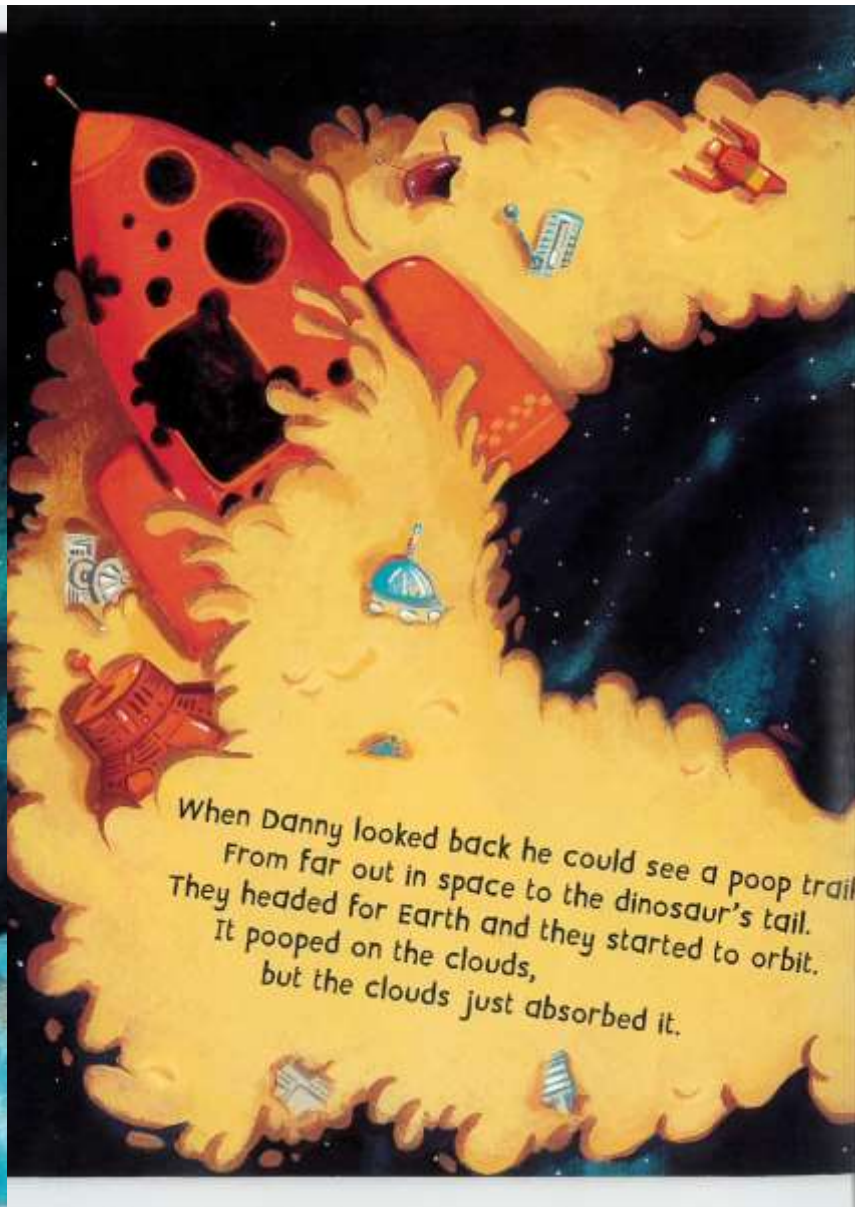
POO!

It pooped the space rovers and Martians from Mars.

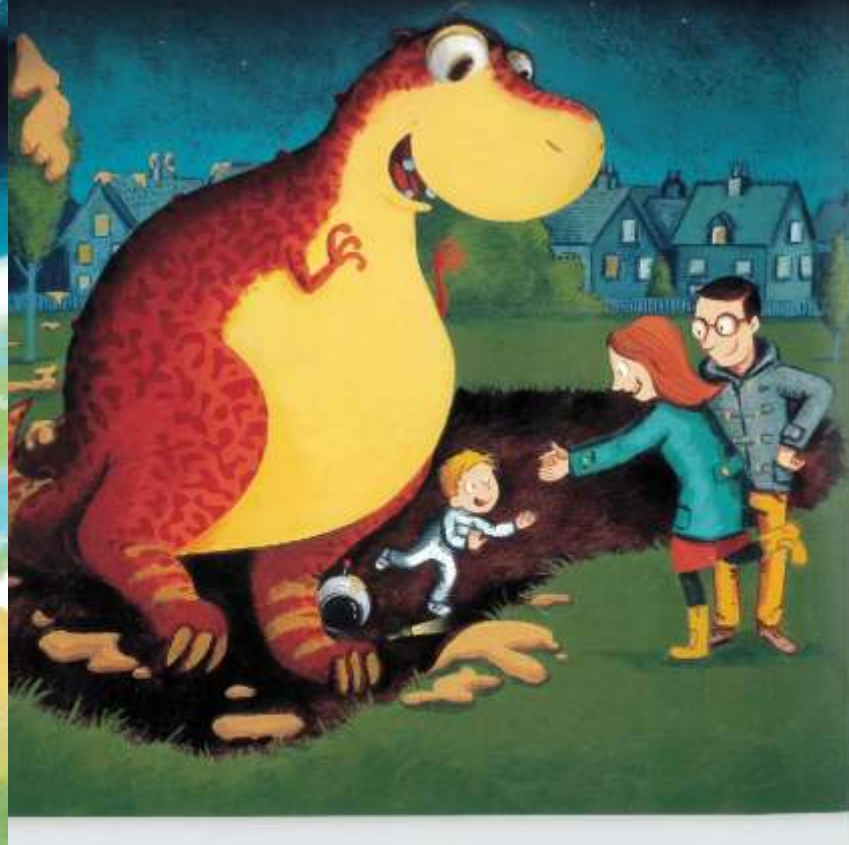


When Danny looked back he could see a poop trail

Length: 2m

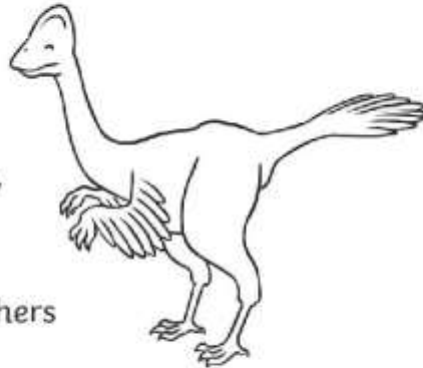
Height: 1.5m

Length: 26m

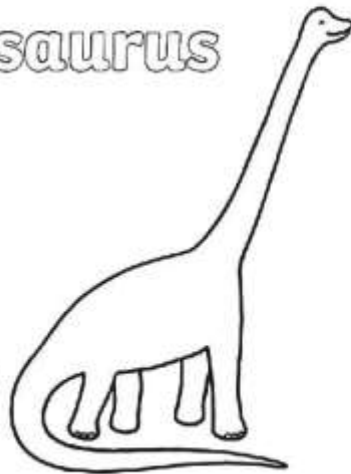

Length: 2m

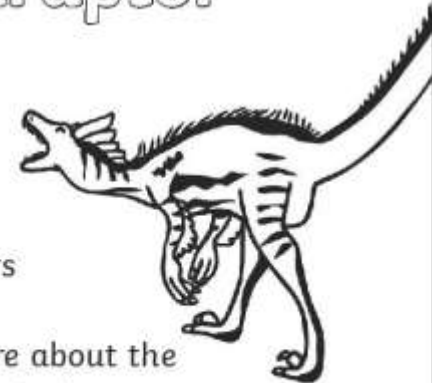
Height: 0.5m

Length: 6m

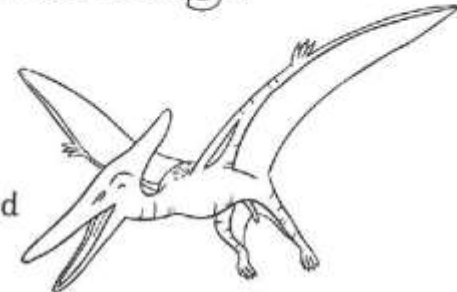
Height: 3m

Length: 9m

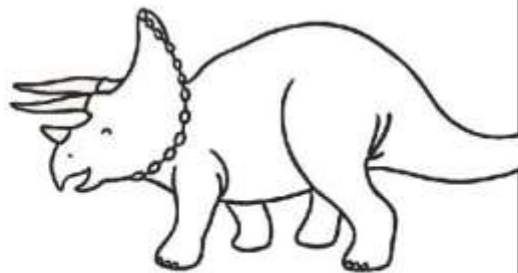

Length: 9m

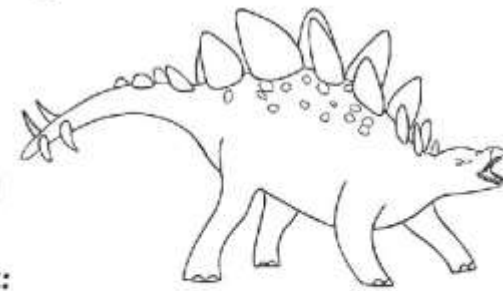

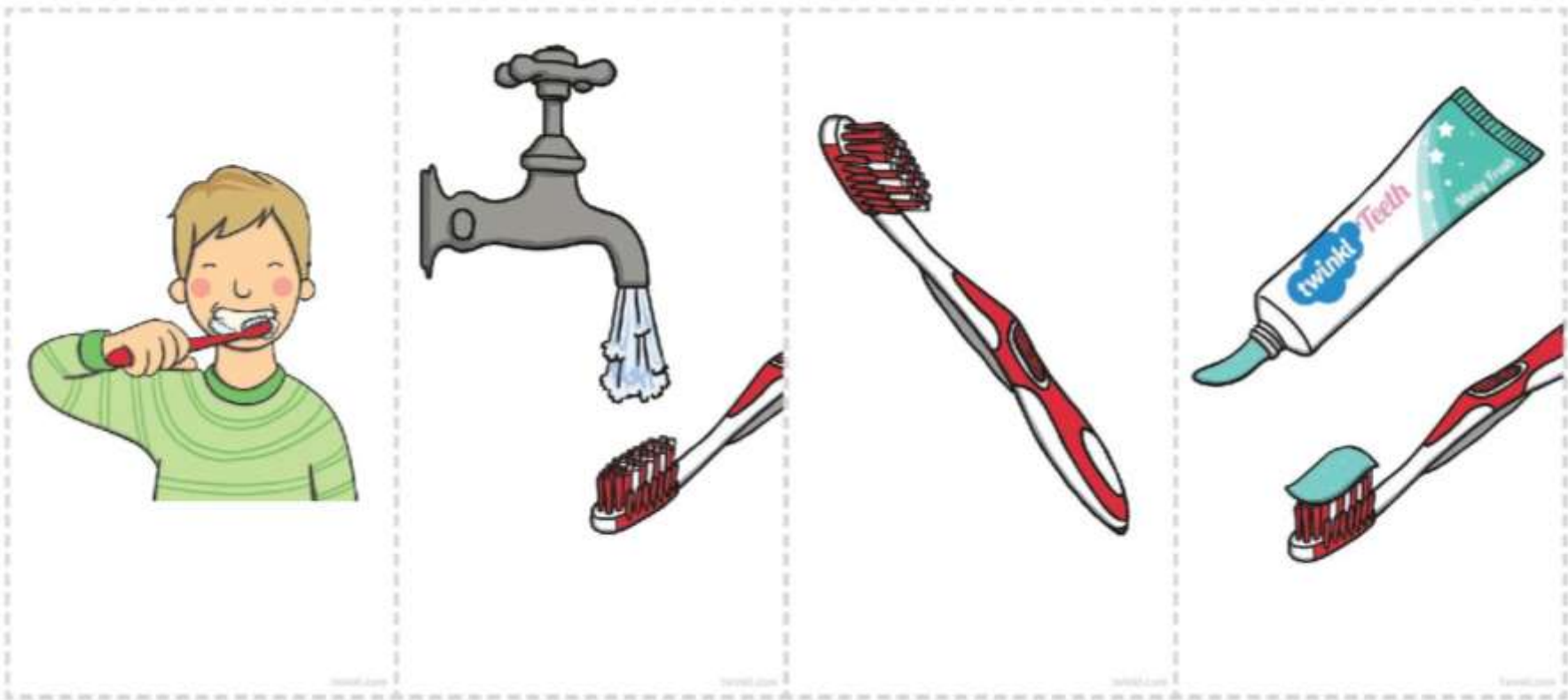
