

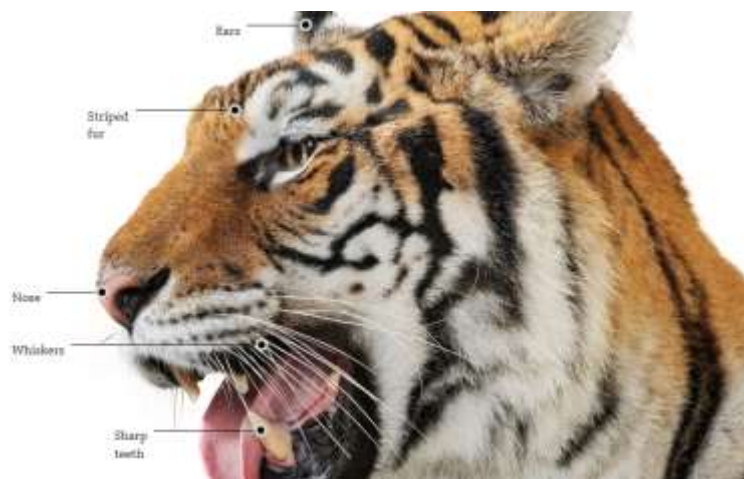
## Tiger information

### Tiger



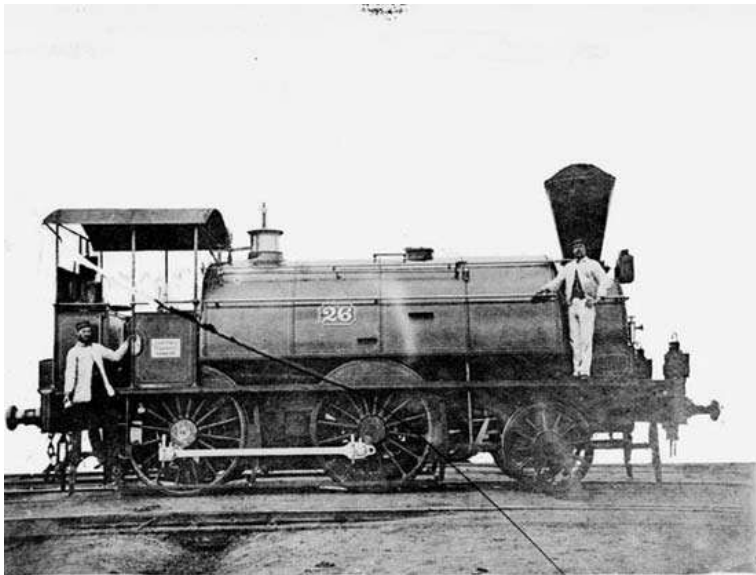
The tiger is the largest, heaviest, and most powerful cat. It is ten times stronger than a human. Adult tigers usually live alone.

However cubs remain with their mother until about their second year, when they are able to kill prey for themselves. Although they spend most of their time on land, tigers are one of the very few cats that love water. They are good swimmers and often lounge around in lakes and streams to cool off from the daytime heat. Tigers are covered in striking stripes, and each animal's markings are unique, just like human fingerprints.



Tigers are carnivores, they eat meat. They tend to eat deer, wild pigs and other small animals. They are part of the 'Cat' family, and have an orange and black stripy coat.

Their habitat is in the tropical forest, or even in some cold forests. As long as there is woodland and lots of trees they are happy. Tigers originally come from South and East Asia.



- A train is made up of carriages (also known as wagons or cars) pulled by an engine (or locomotive). A steam engine also pulls a tender (a wagon containing fuel).
- Steam trains were first built (in the early 1800s) to carry goods and materials, but they soon were used to transport passengers, too.
- Diesel trains started to replace steam trains eventually.

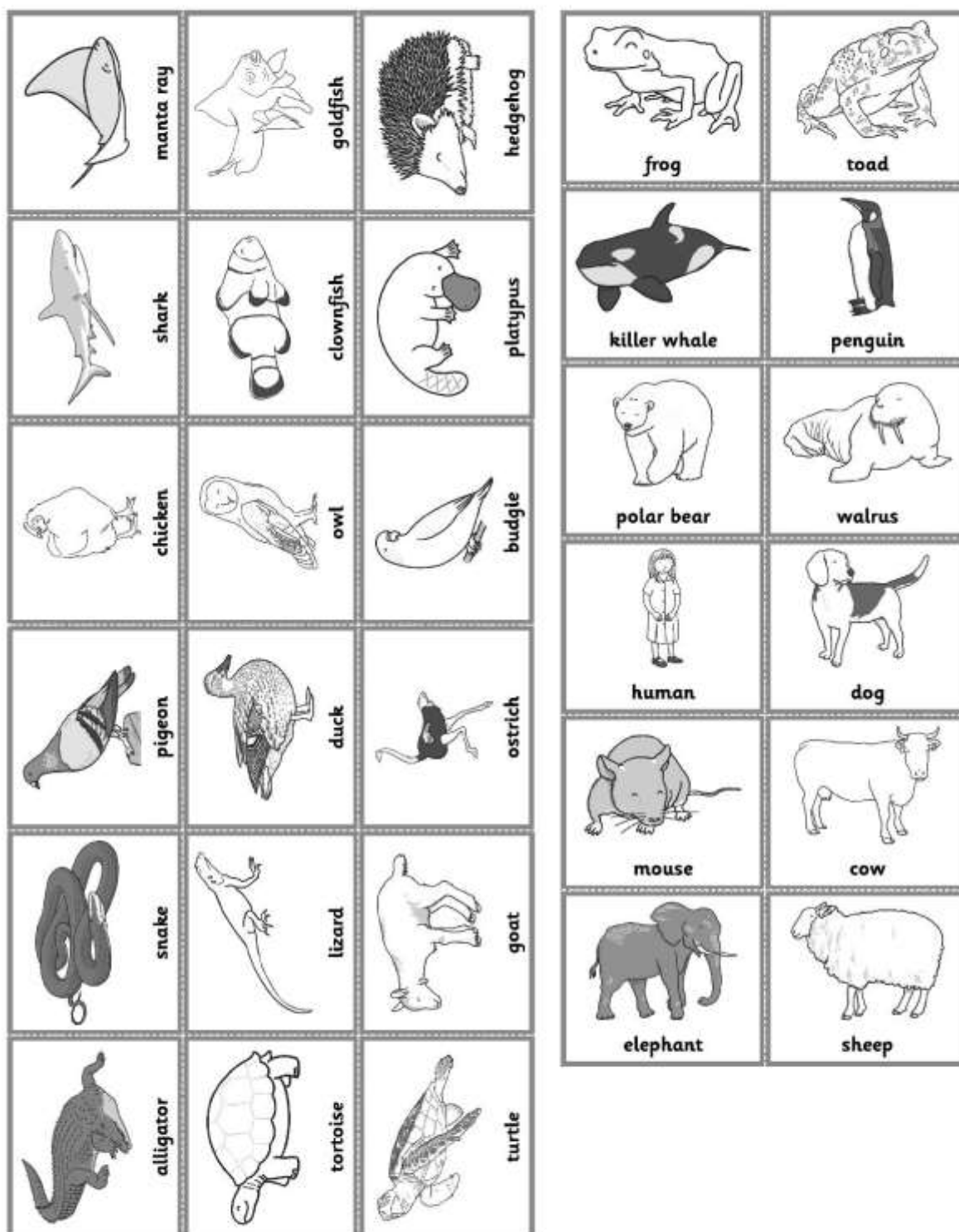


