Writing	<p><b>The Magic Tree</b></p> <p>Look at the picture again</p> <p><b>Task 1: Sentence challenge! Sick sentences!</b></p>															

A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between one thing and another – where it is, the position of it e.g. on, in, next to, between, underneath.

It may tell you where a thing is in relation to something else. E.g. The green, shining door appeared **inside** the tree.

It may tell you when something is in relation to another event. E.g. The portal would not close **until** the electrical storm had ended.

Can you find any prepositions in your writing? Can you write 3 sentences that contain prepositions?

**Task 2:** Can you help improve these sentences? Remember to up level them by varying the start of the sentences, using powerful vocabulary and description (adjectives, adverbs, similes, metaphors). Join the sentences into a paragraph by using conjunctions. Can you add some prepositions?

The bark had begun to peel away, one piece at a time, joining the wreckage of other trees that lay scattered across the scorched earth.</p> <p>This tree was different to the other trees. It contained magic. It contained hope...</p> <p>Can you continue the story? What happens next? What is so different about this tree?
